

Come and Play at Wadanggari Park

If you haven't already been, make sure you come and check out Wadanggari Park at St Leonards.

This fantastic new open space opened recently with hundreds of children and adults coming along to our community open day on Saturday 16 September.

Wadanggari Park is Australia's first park and adventure playground to be built on a bridge over a rail line. The 4750sqm public park has been created over the northern suburbs railway line in what was once unused space and captures new 180-degree views to the city.

Already a big hit with many local children, the new park offers three storeys of challenging climbing equipment, slippery dips for older children and a special young children's zone, as well as extensive covered seating, intriguing paths, a stage, and grassy lawns. It even has a special seat for train spotters! Wadanggari means *banksia* in the local Aboriginal language, and the playground structures represent the three phases of a banksia plant.

The park was built with \$39 million from Council and \$5 million from the NSW Government Public Spaces Legacy program and provides quality recreation space close to rail, bus, and new metro transport links, St Leonards Library and a 300-space Council-owned car park.

Sport and Recreation Centre Underway!

We celebrated the start of construction of Lane Cove's much needed Sport and Recreation Centre on 31 August with the turning of the first sod, marked by Member for Lane Cove Anthony Roberts, Councillors, Council staff and sporting group leaders.

Planning and consultation for the centre began in 2008 with the need identified in Council's Recreation Action Plan. The centre is designed to meet the needs of local residents of all ages and abilities, and will be able to host a range of recreation opportunities such as sport, dancing, social and recreational activities.

The Centre, located on River Road adjacent to Lane Cove Golf Course will include four indoor courts, four outdoor courts, indoor and outdoor dining, multi-purpose community rooms, and pro shop. Golfers can continue to use the course throughout construction.
